Pollinator Partnership Canada has developed the Canadian School Garden Kit; kits support teachers, administrators, guardians, youth groups, after school programs, amongst others, in guiding students through a discovery process that will increase students’ understanding in science, math, and language arts by connecting them to plants, pollinators, food, and gardens through creation of habitat for pollinators and classroom learning.
